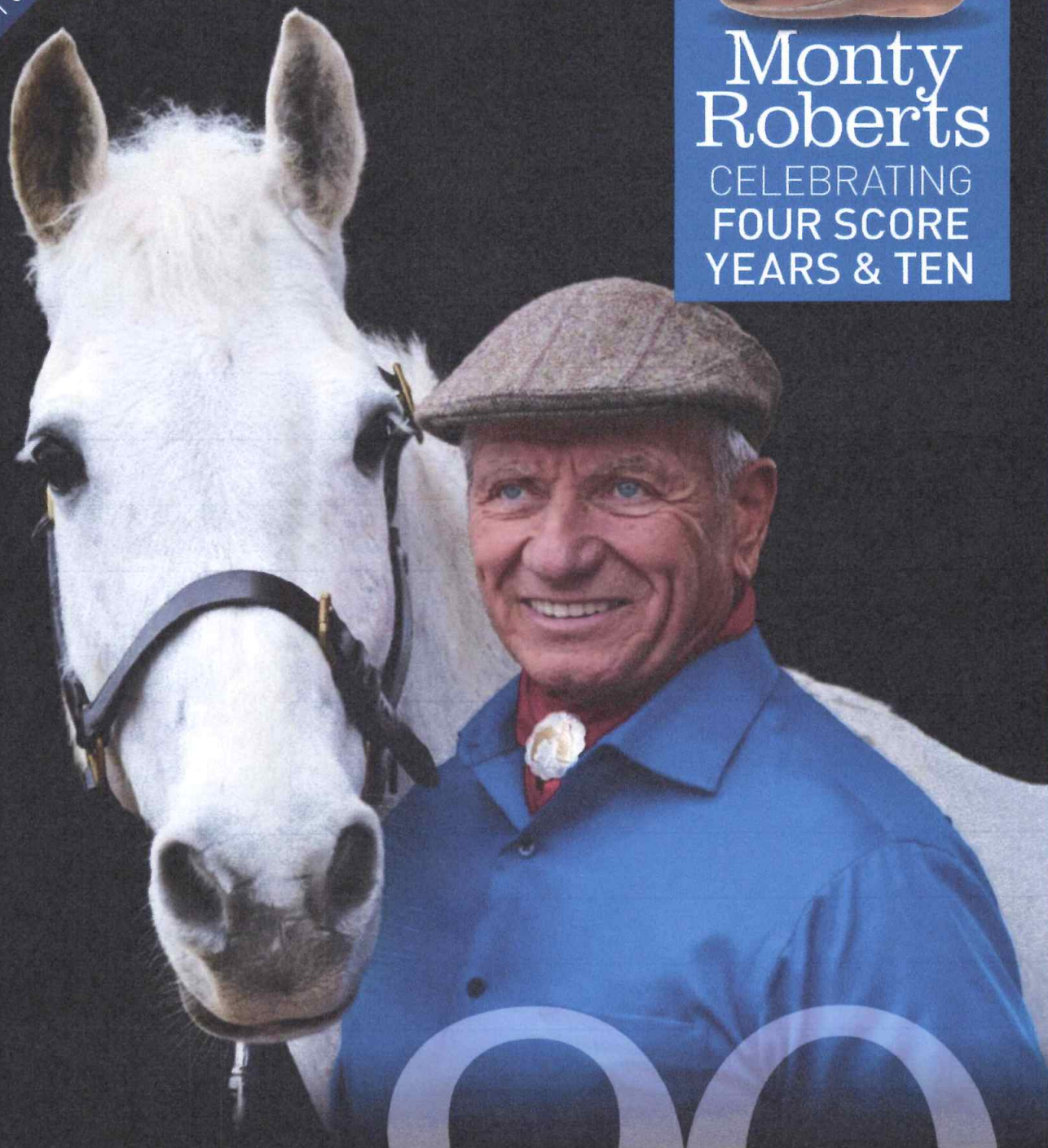

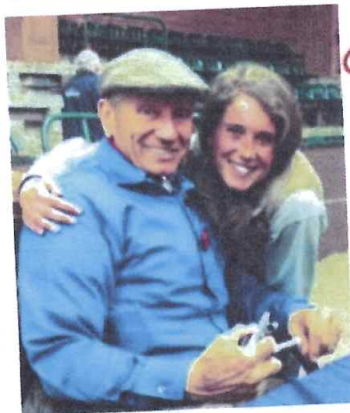

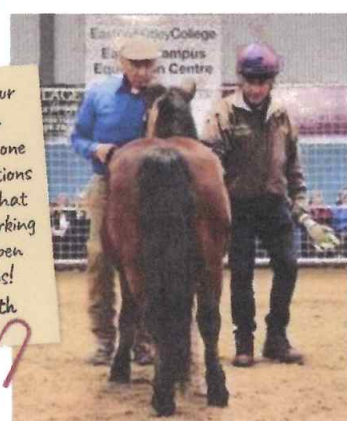
I will continue to share all I know, and what I will learn in the future, with anybody who will listen!
